

Glacial Erratics

These large rocks are glacial erratics and are different from the rock native to this area. These boulders were carried by the movement of glaciers and deposited as the ice melted.

80,000 years ago, during the Wisconsin Ice Age, the Laurentide Ice Sheet extended from Canada's north to as far south as present-day New York City and Boston. In the Great Lakes Region, the Ice was approximately 2km thick. About 20,000 years ago the climate started to warm and the gladers began to melt. As the gluciers streated, they dropped large quantities of sediments that had been captured in the Ice. This included large boulders, called erratics, as well as vast deposits of finer sind, rock and cobble, known as glacial till. The vast quantities of melt water formed the basis for what we know today as the Great Lakes. Other examples of glacial erratics include the 16,500 tonne 'Big Rock' at books. Abert witch is at minory, then wide and 'mail. The Blessdell Boulder in Quinte West is thought to be the largest erratic in Ontario and measures 13m long. 7m wide and on high. GLACIAL ERRATIC

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

Observations

A number of trails need maintenance in order to enhance the security and experience of trail users.

- Are not up to spec. in regard to width
- Need grading/stone dust addition
- Tree hazard
- Have grass/vegetation overgrowth



- Redo compacting of sand stone screenings
- Address drainage issue to avoid flooding on the trail

Trail Maintenance

A simple proposal

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The Problem and potential solution

Most trails have several areas that are in serious need of repair but that do not require a total trail redo.

These areas need to be identified

Simple way would be to take a picture and use "What3Words" to locate them. These could be transferred to the town GIS system

This could be done using the trail captains to provide the detail

The information then could be collected and prioritized and given to Collingwood administration.

TATAC would then maintain the list and updated completion
