Subject: Master Mobility and Transportation Plan (MMTP) Update

Executive Summary

The Master Mobility and Transportation Plan (MMTP) provides a long-term framework to guide Collingwood's transportation planning and policy decisions through 2051. Prepared in accordance with the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment, the MMTP identifies transportation challenges and outlines integrated solutions across walking, cycling, transit and the street network.

Grounded in technical analysis and extensive community engagement, the MMTP aligns with Collingwood's 2024 Official Plan and the 2024-2028 Community Based Strategic Plan, prioritizing safety, accessibility, sustainability and responsible governance. Key outcomes include modernized transportation policies, a safety-first approach, and a focus on optimizing the existing road network rather than constructing new infrastructure.

The MMTP is a strategic roadmap, not a funding or construction commitment, and provides Council with a flexible, evidence-based foundation to guide future transportation decisions and investments.

The attached report is the culmination of 2 years of work by EXP Consulting Engineers outlining vision and methodology to support recommendations for the future of transportation and mobility in Collingwood.

Next Steps Towards Adopting the MMTP

- April 27, 2026

- Posting of the MMTP technical report and staff cover memo.
- Council and public review period begins.
- **May 2026**
 - Council members, and public review materials and submit questions or comments.
 - Staff coordinate responses and clarifications with the consultant as needed.
- **June 2026**
 - Following the review period, staff will bring forward a staff report to Council requesting that Council receive the final report from the MMTP, including its recommendations and proposed policy updates. The report will outline next steps related to policy adoption, future implementation, and alignment with financial and capital planning processes.
 - Issue the Notice of Completion under the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (MCEA) process to initiate the statutory 30-day review period.

Conclusion

The MMTP represents a significant step in the long-range planning work for the Town. This staged approach is intended to support informed discussion, transparency, and clarity, while recognizing the complexity and scale of the undertaking. Staff look forward to continued engagement with Council over the coming weeks and will return with a formal staff report once the review period is complete.
